



Printing Monoprints

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Types of suitable print papers for monotype printing in oil and water base media. Ex: Rives BFK

Plastic or Plexi-Glass plate, 9" x 15"x .12" for press printing impressions Plastic or Plexi-Glass plates, 8"x 10"x .25" to 18" x 24" x .25" for hand printing impressions

Smooth surface plastic sheet for shielding printing paper from shredding during hand printing

Baren tool

Painting tape

At least 2 Clamps

Blotters

Cotton rags

Scissors

Glass sheet up to 18" x 24" x .25" for mixing and rolling out inks and paints Ink/paint mixing spatulas Shallow baking/sheet pans for soaking paper

***Students may work in oil and/or water-soluble media

Oil Base Media List:

Oil Paint Mineral Spirits Oil Based Printing inks Oil paint brushes in all types and sizes Small printing hand rollers Single edge razor blades Oil paint brushes of various sizes and types

Spray bottle
