



## Interpretation of Sound: 80s (Session 6)

\*\*For the first class, bring one large canvas, and at least one 11" x 14" canvas

A large canvas of your choice; for example, a 24" x 36" or a 30" x 40", a pack of six 11" x 14" canvases

I highly recommend using: Golden acrylic paints (high flow, fluids or heavy body or a combination). This brand has a high pigment load, and a diverse array of colors to choose from; they also have iridescent and interference colors, which can really enhance a piece, especially one that is so highly interpretative to sound and emotions. Colors are your choice.

You may also use other brands of your choice, but I recommend Amsterdam, Holbein, Daler & Rowney, Winsor & Newton, Grumbacher, and many more (this is not an extensive list, just suggestions).

You will also need paint brushes; I recommend a variety: angular, round tip, flat, mop and filbert

High gloss and matte varnish

Palette knives

A plastic cup or container for water

Palmolive soap

Paper towels or cloth for wiping and cleaning brushes & materials

You may also want to use sponges, or other materials you want to experiment with to create texture.
