

THE SCHOLARSHIP JUDGES

Patrick Morrison will judge all entries for scholarship awards. He is an award-winning painter, teacher, and bluegrass musician. He was the first art teacher on the Naples High School staff and started his 35-year teaching career with the school system in 1968. He taught drawing, painting, two-dimensional design, and computer graphics including Photoshop, Adobe Illustrator, and InDesign before retiring in 2003.

Many of Morrison's students participated in the NAA's scholarship program, earned college degrees, and then went on to achieve success in the visual arts as working artists, college art professors, advertising agency creative directors, and multimedia animators. Morrison has a Master of Arts degree in education from Murray State University in Kentucky and a Bachelor of Fine Arts degree from Ringling College of Art and Design in Sarasota. He currently manages Morrison Graphics, a photography restoration business, with his wife Sharon.

Dr. Larry R. Thompson will assign the Ringling College of Art and Design scholarship award. He is currently celebrating his 20th anniversary as president of Ringling College of Art and Design. Dr. Thompson is passionate about the arts and education and has worked tirelessly to infuse his spirit of inclusion throughout the campus by celebrating diversity; encouraging freedom of expression; supporting new ways of teaching and learning; and encouraging risk-taking to enhance the overall academic experience.

Dr. Thompson is president for the Association of Independent Colleges of Art and Design (AICAD) and the President's Council of the Independent Colleges and Universities of Florida (ICUF), where he serves as treasurer. Locally, he is chairman of the Sarasota County Arts Council and is a board member of Coastal Behavioral Healthcare, the Community Health Corporation for Sarasota Memorial Hospital, SunTrust, Sarasota Season of Sculpture, and the Sarasota Chamber of Commerce. He also participates on the Economic Development Corporation of Sarasota County Partners Council and 82° TECH's education committee. He is a member of the Realize Bradenton steering committee and is also human development advisor to the weekly cable television program, *City Design*.

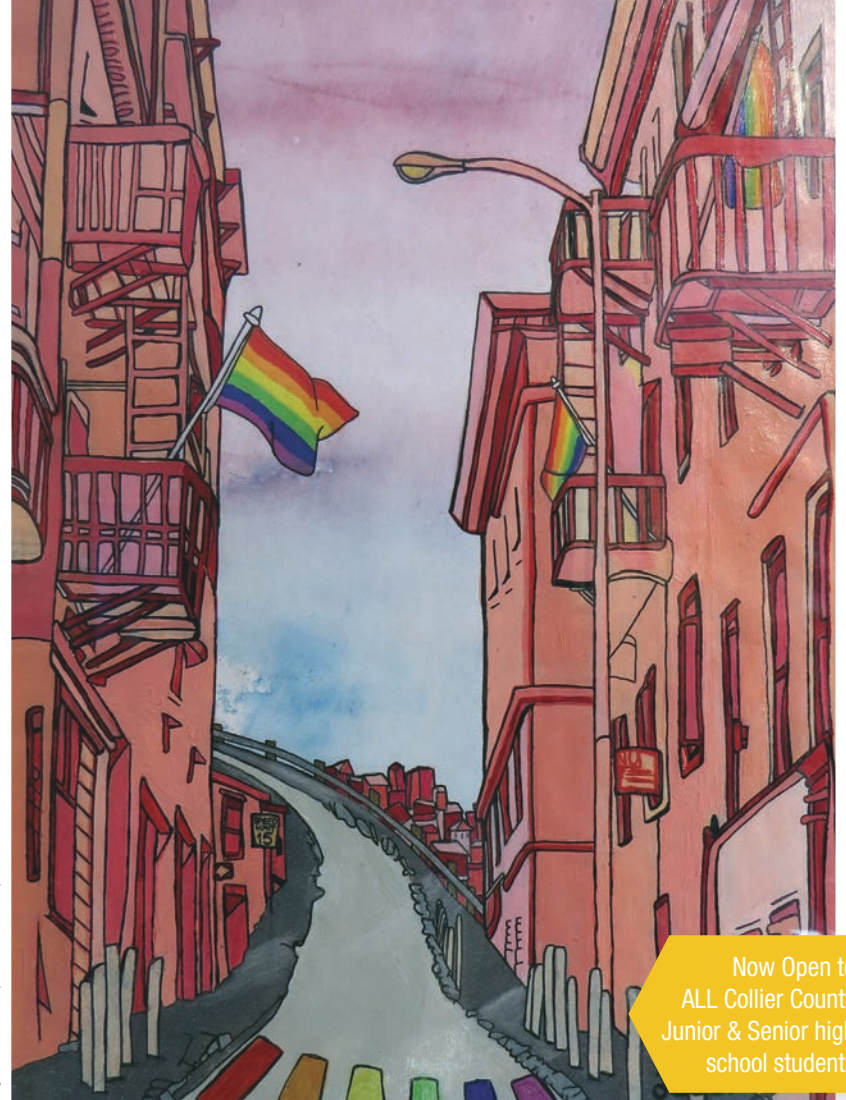

The Jade Riedel Scholarship Competition and Exhibition is open to Collier County High School juniors and seniors who will be majoring in art at an accredited college or university. The goal of the scholarship program is to encourage aspiring artists to further their artistic development at the college level. Scholarship dollars are sent to the financial aid offices of colleges and universities where scholarship winners are enrolled as declared Art Majors.

In addition to the opportunity to compete for scholarship awards, applicants will have their artwork professionally displayed in the Naples Art Association (NAA) from April 13 to April 27, 2019. The Naples Woman's Club and The Ringling College of Art and Design are partners in the program. During the 2019 competition, the NAA will award \$10,000 in scholarships to individuals pursuing a college major or minor in art, the Naples Woman's Club will award \$1,000 in scholarships and The Ringling College of Art and Design will award one \$20,000 scholarship to a student who has applied and been accepted for the 2019-2020 academic year.

ORIGINS In 1971, NAA artists initiated a college scholarship program designed to encourage young aspiring artists to follow their dreams of becoming professionals in the visual arts. Now in its 48th year, the NAA is pleased to continue its college scholarship legacy thanks to community support. Jade Riedel was an exceptional artist and NAA instructor who served as the chair of the scholarship program and was its chief fundraiser for many years. The program was named after her to honor her memory and vision.

The General Federation of Women's Clubs annual Eileen Steen Art Scholarship: Eileen Steen was a 25-year member of the Naples Woman's Club who was a passionate supporter of the arts. Eileen Steen Art Scholarships are awarded yearly for excellent artwork.

ELIGIBILITY All Collier County junior and senior high school students are eligible to participate. Each applicant may enter one original two or three-dimensional work of art. Copies of original artwork are not eligible. Scholarships are awarded based on the artwork entered and the student's intent to further study art at the college level. To be eligible for the \$20,000 Ringling College of Art and Design scholarship, the student must have applied and been accepted to Ringling College for Fall 2019 or Spring 2020.

SIZE AND PRESENTATION Two-dimensional artwork is not to exceed 40" x 40" including frame. Works on paper must be matted in white or off-white. Frames are recommended, but not required. Paintings on stretched canvas must be presentable and ready for gallery installation. Three-dimensional artwork must fit on a 14" x 14" gallery pedestal.

BASIS OF AWARDS Scholarship awards will be assigned based on the following criteria: originality; knowledge and technique; utilization of design principles; and composition, presentation, and proof of the student's intention to continue art studies at the college level.

ENTRY PROCEDURE Complete the "Artwork Registration Form." Deliver your artwork to the Naples Art Association, located at 585 Park Street in Naples on Tuesday, April 2 or Wednesday, April 3, 2019 between 2:00 p.m. and 6:00 p.m. Artwork must remain with the NAA until the scheduled pick up date (April 29). All paint must be dry with artwork ready for gallery installation.

RECEPTIONS On Friday, April 12, 2019 from 5:30 to 7:30 p.m. the NAA will host a reception for three exhibitions at 585 Park Street in Naples. During the reception, the scholarship winners will be announced. Award winners in the Southwest Florida Fine Craft Guild's exhibition

"Crafted by Hand" will also be announced. Announcements will begin at approximately 6:30 p.m. in the NAA's Frederick O. Watson Gallery. There is a \$10 voluntary donation at the door to attend the reception. Students exhibiting in the Jade Riedel Scholarship Competition will be admitted at no cost along with one adult. Name tags for students will be available at a check-in table located on your left-hand side when entering. Please use the Park Street pedestrian ramp to enter for the reception.

A second reception will be held for Eileen Steen Scholarship Awards winners at the Naples Woman's Club located at 570 Park Street in Naples. Artwork by the two Eileen Steen Scholarship award winners will be displayed at the Naples Woman's Club during the reception.

ARTWORK PICK UP Artwork pick up will be held at the NAA on Monday, April 29 from 2:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. If you are unable to pick up your artwork on April 29, your artwork will be available for pick up through May 25 (excluding Sundays) between 10:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. Storage space is limited and students are strongly encouraged to pick up their artwork. Artwork not picked up by June 7, 2019 will be considered abandon and may no longer be kept by the NAA.

SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS Scholarship award funds will be paid directly to the approved institution where the award recipient is enrolled as an art major. No scholarship funds are given directly to individual students. Scholarship funds are to be used only for post-high school art studies in accredited universities, colleges, and schools of art and design with final approval by the NAA.

To be eligible for the \$20,000 Ringling College of Art and Design scholarship, students must apply and be accepted to the College for Fall 2019 or Spring 2020. The scholarship will be provided over a four-year period with \$5,000 applied throughout each academic year. The Naples Woman's Club will award two \$500 scholarships. The NAA will award its scholarships in the following amounts: one \$5,000, one \$2,500, two \$1,000, and one \$500. All NAA scholarships must be used within five years of the award date.

Award recipients for NAA funded scholarships will be asked to compose a handwritten thank-you note to the scholarship sponsor and return it to Jack O'Brien by no later than April 19, 2019. A card and envelope will be provided to each NAA scholarship award winner.
